1. Chairman's welcome and report.

We will break for lunch at around 12:30-13:00 hours and will have comfort breaks if required.

I'd like to congratulate all the winners this year at all the BFTA events and congratulations to everyone. There were some great battles in all grades and at the opens.

Overall it has been a great season with mixed results numbers wise.

The start of the year saw great numbers at events, but those numbers started to drop off after the Throckmorton GP, which I would like to add is a great new venue for us and we hope it stays as a BFTA venue for a long time ahead.

It would be great to keep good numbers at events throughout the whole year hence why I have brought up the same proposal as last year which will be discussed again today to look at possible changes to hopefully increase numbers for the whole season and not just at the start.

It is with a heavy heart that the field target community lost 3 big characters of the sport this year.

Firstly Mike Noon passed away in April, Mike was a huge part of Field Target in its early stages and a close friend to everyone including myself. It was because of Mike I got involved in the BFTA as a trade liaison officer which I often thanked him for dragging me into the fold.

Secondly, Mike's wife Beryl passed away in October, everyone knows how influential Beryl was in Field Target and, between her and Mike, helped get Field Target to where it is today. They were stalwarts for the BFTA for many years, and I am personally hit by the loss of never being able to see them up NEFTA at the odd event like the Classic. They are who I used to call My FT parents along with Hugh and Pat Osborne, Mike and Beryl will be sorely missed by everyone who knows them. My thoughts are with Lorraine, Jono and Joanne and the rest of the Noon family. I hope they are both safe up there and I can imagine mam is giving orders to everyone already.

Thirdly, Chris Jones passed away earlier this month after losing his battle with cancer. Chris has been a close friend of mine for many years, I personally will miss not seeing him and chatting to him regularly either at the shoots or over the phone. Chris was a big part of SWEFTA and East Devon which is a club that he loved and put a huge amount of effort into every year. My thoughts are with Kez and the rest of Chris's family.

Field Target has lost 3 huge personalities and 3 people who have been a positive in the sport for many years. I personally will miss you 3 as you have all been a great influence in my time within this sport that I love, and for that I cannot thank you enough.

I am standing down as Chairman this year and I will concentrate on taking on the Trade Liaison Officers' role hopefully with Adam Avison this year to push on from where Simon Francis left this year. Personally I'd like to thank Simon for all his efforts this year as trade liaison as I know he did a superb job in one of the toughest roles to carry out. I know the Chair will be taken on by a person who has been the heart and soul of the BFTA since he got involved and I look forward to the challenges ahead whatever they may be.

6. Treasurer's report (Annex A)

The Chairman thanked James for his work as Treasurer.

Points arising:

- A reminder that regions have been provided with full equipment provision for hosting events. It is the responsibility of the region to maintain the equipment and to purchase replacement equipment.
- If a region needs to replace equipment, then they should contact James Kay who will inform them where the originals were purchased.
James requested that at each subsequent meeting that regional reps provide an inventory of the equipment that they hold.
- The Chairman asked John Oxley to explore the idea of housing the old perpetual trophies at Emley. It was suggested that we should buy a cabinet to display them.
- The Secretary initiated a conversation about the interest in the Showdown. It was suggested by James Osborne that perhaps the Showdown has had its day. It was agreed to the cessation of the Showdown for one year. It would be replaced with a two-day Masters. The format would be: 2 x 30 x 2 days for the overall Masters; trophies will be 1-10 overall and 1st – 3rd in grades and classes. Also, on each day there will be a trophy for the winner in each grade and class.

8. Fees and subscriptions for 2026

- BFTA Card £5
- BFTA Championship and Inter-Regional = £15. £1500* to club.
- BFTA Inter-Regional = £75 per team
- BFTA Masters = £15 per day or £30 for the weekend.
- GP Singles = £15 (Minimum £900* to the club plus £5 for each shooter above 100 entrants)
- GP Doubles = £15 (Minimum £1500* to the club plus £5 for each shooter above 100 entrants) if at same venue. If the venue is at the same ground then £900 for one day and £750 for the next.
- The British Open = £40. £1500* to club.

* Failure to provide facilities as above (e.g., inadequate toilets) may result in the hosting club receiving a reduced fee of £750 or £1350.

For the end of season raffle in 2026, 4 entries are required. If a shooter has 3 recorded scores (or GP7 is their 3rd GP) then at GP7 they can pay £10 to be entered into the raffle.

BFTA contribution to raffle and end of season prizes for 2026:

£4000 to be managed by the Trade Liaison Officer.

The Chairman thanked Shaun, Scott, John, Simon and Becky for their work.

Grading: after the 2026 season the Grading Officer will analyse the distribution of grades and realign such that: AA is approximately 15% of active shooters, 35% in A, 35% in B and 15% in C.

Trade and Liaison: Secretary asked where are the BFTA banners?

BFTA banner is with Trev, this needs to be transferred to Millride for the Champs/Inters weekend. John Oxley to action.

BFTA British Open is in the IOW, this needs to be transferred to Shaun who will ensure that it is delivered to Throckmorton. Andrew Slade to action.

Media: James Osborne suggested involving a professional video creator. Becky said that that had been explored but it was expensive.

Simon suggested introducing a celebrity to FT to allow FT to be shared with the celebrity's online following.

13.1 Allow course setters for GP to choose between 3 lanes standing and 2 kneeling or 2 lanes standing and 3 kneeling. **Not carried.**

13.3 Shooters that are graded as AA remain in AA even if their percentage drops below AA standard. (MFTA). **Not carried**

13.4 Final GP should be in a central location. (Needs proposer and details). **Carried but logistics prevented it being actioned.**

~~13.5 GPs reduced to 1 session if less than 85 entrants. Start time 1000; this decision is made when booking is closed. Those paying on the day will have to check the BFTA website to confirm if there are 1 or 2 sessions. **Withdrawn**~~

13.6 Uniform safety brief with the addition of items pertinent to the ground being used. (Needs proposer and details). **Carried. Mark will work on this with collaboration from other committee members.**

13.7 Reintroduce 6 x £25 bonus bunny. (NEFTA). **Carried**

13.8 Review the way overall ties in the GP series are decided. (Needs proposer and details). **Carried. The format will be: if percentages are tied for best 4 from 7, then 5 from 7 will be compared, then 6 from 7 and 7 from 7. If percentages are still tied after 7 from 7 then a shoot-off will be required. The format of the shoot-off will be: 2 x kneelers and 2 x standers, if tied then 2 x standers, if tied then sudden death on one target standing.**

13.10 Change the last entry time for the Masters from 11.45 am to 10.30 am. (Rationale: with 2 courses running simultaneously most shooters have commenced shooting at 10.00 am. If we allow shooters to book in as late as 11.45 am then we risk a situation that most shooters have finished yet we still have shooters on the course which delays shoot-offs and prize giving). At last year's AGM we closed 2024 season with a balance of €32,745.22 - split across the current account €22,502.36 and deposit account €10,242.86
As at 31st October 2025 the 32 Day Deposit account is showing a balance of €10,477.49, 90 day deposit €11,349.93 with the main account €8,431.68
Overall, despite buying new perpetual trophies and 10 Falcon scopes for prizes we are only €1,586.12 changed (down) on last year.

As treasurer I believe that the card money generates revenue to fund the operation of the BFTA and remains sufficient even given card numbers fell 5% from 613 down to 581. Propose this remains at £5

I have shown the scopes retained for 2026 prizes as coming from the 'Admin' pot - Prizes given in 2025 have been shown against income for those comps

As the Showdown is an extension of the GP series I have included the costs of the Showdown as part of the GP series. Even with the costs of 3 x Falcon scopes as prizes and the replacement of all perpetual trophies the GP series as a whole made a small overall loss.

Given we have spent an additional £1,850 on Prizes and £1,320 on perpetual trophies this suggests that the BFTA has a 'prize pot' each year of circa £3. If we present each grade winner £100 and second place £50 this would be £900 per 'cash event'. Meaning we could cover GP series / Champs and Master on same format - or continue to use the £3,000 to buy raffle prizes which seem to go down well.

The cash balance at the bank would support a 'prize' fund of £4,000 each year if we were to use some of our surplus £30,000.

My proposal would be to have a prize pot of £4,000 PA to spend as the Trade Liason sees fit in conjunction with the Committee

Inters - Team entry of £75 means we run inters at a loss as this was based on 8 regions to generate £600. We can absorb loss as we are giving back to community and not just winners - hopefully a good introduction to GP shooting for team members - break even costs would be closer to £100 team
Propose no change to team entry cost of £75 - and keep £5 on day to shoot

Masters - as an event costs £750 hosting (as share with Showdown) along with Trophies circa £1,100 - if we had 75 shooters we would need £25 head to current costs - discuss entry fee or trophy values - £15x75 entrants = £1,125. We can maintain the status quo but promote event more to ensure people know they can attend and its open to all and not just those that qualify for showdown.

Annex B – Secretary's Report

I would like to pay tribute to Beryl Noon who sadly passed away in October. I served with Beryl on this committee and learned from the experience. My fondest memories of her are from Weston Park. Her arrival, supported by Mike, heeded that the goodies were available and most importantly her marvellous cakes. Rest in peace Beryl.

I also pay tribute to Chris Jones. His tragic early passing has shocked and upset the FT community. My heartfelt condolences to Kez Jones and to his family. Rest in peace Chris.

Another season has flown by, and I'd like to offer some thanks and congratulations:

- To Mark for sorting all event trophies.
- To Scott for his administration of events and his sterling work at the World Championships.

After the GP season I put together a survey in two parts to hear the voices of BFTA shooters. The first part was answered by 52 people. I condensed their responses into 23 not/agree broad proposals. I received 74 responses. What I think it revealed most is that where they may be contention about issues there is broadness of views. I think that there is mileage to do something similar in the future. Whilst there is presently an appetite for change I feel a national survey would help us form what that change might look like.

May I thank all of those that contribute to this committee.

BFTA Shooters/Cards

Thanks to the Regions for their assistance in collating the requests from their clubs for BFTA cards, and for completing the card details for Shooters.

We currently have 585 (Vs 610 last year) shooters cards issued this year, with the bulk of these issued by March 2025. We continued to have new card requests during the BFTA shoot season, even as late as October.

The payment system of bank transfer to the BFTA Bank account for cards was used by most regions, and this task was completed without any major issues. Thanks to James Kay for his prompt communication of payments received.

I will email the regions in January 2026 for the lists of shooters that require a BFTA Number/Card, applying the same procedure as last year. I will however, in addition ask regions to specify which shooters are PCP, Piston or Open, to ensure that shooters have the correct classification.

BFTA Grading System

Thanks to everyone for sending me the average %'s for the Winter and Summer leagues, which were incorporated into the grading spreadsheet.

The grading spreadsheet has been posted on the BFTA Facebook site and on the BFTA website, to enable shooters to review their grading results.

Scores from 2023 have been deleted from the rolling 12 spreadsheet as scores older than two years old are not included in the grading % calculation.

I have noted that several shooters with expired BFTA numbers have attended shoots this year, and as a result their scores were not used for grading.

As you can see from the table there has been no change in AA, however the number of A class shooters has increased with B & C numbers reduced.

If the grade bands were adjusted to achieve the targeted % by band, then this would result in the following changes to grade bands:

AA – no change

A – Change from 76% to 77% - this would result in 19 shooters being re-graded as B Class

B – Change from 60% to 63% - this would result in 7 shooters being re-graded as C class

I have not changed the grade band %'s over the last 3 years, primarily because shooters felt that changing this every year had a detrimental effect on their motivation to achieve a higher grade. However I now believe that a re-banding is required to rebalance grades to the target %, given that A, B, and C are now well outside target.

Can we discuss this in AOB.

Finally, thanks again to everyone for their assistance with Shooter's cards/Grading, your input has certainly made my job easier.

Firstly thank you to the BFTA for trusting me in this role , it was great to have an opportunity to give back to a sport that has given me so much over the years that I've been involved in it .

My visit to the shooting show in February wasn't as fruitful as I'd imagined but I did manage to distribute the majority of the fliers that Chris printed off for the BFTA and also put a face to my name with the H&N team!

I think most stalls were focused on sales and not gifting, encouraging me to contact them via email instead.

My biggest success rate came from telephone conversations, Rowan Engineering, JSB, Aim, Sportsmatch, Sureshot, AJP custom parts , Advanced Targets and H&N showing great support for our sport , I'd suggest we spend some money with them this coming season, all made donations which worked well for me because the bulk of my budget went on the T50's that Nick kindly offered us .

Air Arms supported the British open via Trev but sadly seemed to be undecided as to any other commitments to us , choosing to leave me hanging until the last minute but said they would be interested in any new ideas the BFTA has for future projects.

I'd like to thank Nick (Falcon) for his support this year , especially for attending and providing a top prize at the IOW shoot , which turned out to be a great weekend and the raffle table was nearly as good as the GP series raffle with the 60mag, 2 t50's and other

goodies that were all donated.
